IPA REPRESENTED AT MISPA VIII – STRENGTHENING PRESENCE IN THE AMERICAS

From 16 to 17 July 2025, the International Police Association (IPA) was officially represented for the first time at the 8th Meeting of Ministers on Public Safety of the Americas (MISPA VIII), hosted by the Organization of American States (OAS) in Santiago de los Caballeros, Dominican Republic.

This milestone marks a significant step in expanding the IPA's global visibility and relevance. While no formal presentation was scheduled, the presence of IPA International President Martin Hoffmann allowed for meaningful engagement with senior police and government officials from across the continent and underlined the IPA's commitment to contributing to international security dialogue.



President Hoffmann used this opportunity to introduce the mission and structure of the IPA in direct conversations, highlighting the Association's 380,000 members across 69 recognised sections worldwide, including representation in the Americas through the sections of the USA, Canada, Brazil, Argentina, and Peru. He also pointed to the provisional section in Colombia, as well as Costa Rica and the Dominican Republic, both of which are expected to be officially recognised as Sections in Foundation next year, provided that all statutory requirements are met.



Among the IPA's international initiatives discussed during bilateral meetings was the newly launched Spanish-language online seminar series, aimed at supporting member engagement and professional exchange across Latin America. The first sessions will focus on organised crime and drug trafficking (November 2025), followed by cybercrime and artificial intelligence (February 2026).

In the context of the conference, President Hoffmann was officially received by the leadership of IPA Dominican Republic and senior officials of the Dominican National Police.

IPA REPRESENTED AT MISPA VIII – STRENGTHENING PRESENCE IN THE AMERICAS



Mr José Espinal Rodríguez, Acting President of IPA Dominican Republic, welcomed the visit with a formal reception and presented a plaque of recognition to President Hoffmann. The meeting was attended by Colonel Roenny Cataño, Director of International Cooperation, Colonel Oliver Gonell, and Dr José Cáceres Mendoza, along with several members of the IPA Dominican Republic board.

The IPA's debut at MISPA VIII reflects its growing role as a neutral, global platform for police cooperation and professional development. Strengthening the Association's presence in the Americas is a strategic priority, and the Dominican Republic visit underlined the mutual interest in deepening ties between the IPA and law enforcement institutions across the region.

IPA's First World Football Tournament Unites Over 500 Participants in Albania

From 4 to 8 June 2025, the International Police Association (IPA) proudly hosted its First World Football Tournament in the stunning seaside town of Velipojë, Albania — an event that brought together the spirit of sport, international friendship, and professional unity.

A total of 23 teams — 19 men's teams and 4 women's teams — participated, with more than 500 participants from across the globe. Matches were played with intensity, professionalism, and mutual respect, reflecting the core values of the IPA: *Servo per Amikeco* — Service through Friendship.

The tournament opened with a prestigious opening ceremony, a vibrant and emotional start to the event, made even more special by the honoured presence of the Minister of Interior of Albania, Mr. Ervin Hoxha. His attendance, along with local and international guests, highlighted the significance of this event not only for the IPA but for the entire host nation. The IPA was also honoured by the presence of IPA President Martin Hoffmann, and three IEB members: Kíkis Perikleous, Jean Pierre Allet, and Christos Parginos, as well as members of the IPA Sports Project team, who played a key role in planning and executing this successful tournament.

Throughout the week, Velipojë offered an ideal setting for competition and connection. Beyond the games, participants engaged in cultural exchange, built lasting friendships, and strengthened the IPA's international network. The tournament has set a strong precedent and promises to become a cherished tradition within the IPA calendar.

The SCC and the Sports Project Team will conduct a comprehensive review of the inaugural edition of the IPA World Football Tournament. Based on their evaluation, they will develop a

clear set of procedures and propose optimal solutions to enhance the planning and execution of future editions.

JAPANESE FOOTBALL PLAYER FINDS LIFELONG TEAMMATES AT IPA WORLD FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT

Mr. Ryuichiro Nakano, a 51-year-old member of the IPA Kanagawa Region of Japan, joined the IPA at the end of last year. He soon decided to participate in the 1st IPA World Football Tournament held in Shkodër, Albania, in June. With five years of football experience, as well as six years each in tennis and swimming, he was wondering how he could contribute to the IPA's activities. He waited for other Japanese players to sign-up, but it was determined that he would be the only Japanese player and join the International World Team. I also decided to visit there to support him and encourage the event as a member of the Sports Project Team of the Socio-Cultural Commission.

Mr. Nakano's journey to Shkodër was tough due to the flight schedule. He arrived at Tirana International Airport at midnight on June 4th and checked into the hotel at 3 am on the 5th, the day of the elimination round. After showering and resting briefly, he left the hotel at 8 am to meet the coach of the International World Team, Mr. Armando Cungu, and his UK, German, and Italian teammates at the football ground.



After a brief greeting, they all went out onto the field to warm up. It was scorching outside with temperatures nearly reaching 35 degrees Celsius. They played against teams from North Macedonia, Croatia, Israel, and Romania, and he appeared in three of the games. Their average age was higher than that of the other national teams', but they ran tirelessly and kicked the ball toward the opponents' goal. The sunshine and heat exhausted them, and after the final game, they collapsed onto the grass.

After watching them give their all in tough conditions until the final whistle, I realised that playing a game with sincerity is more important than winning. Although they left the field after four consecutive losses, they formed lifelong bonds with their teammates. Mr. Nakano said that he was happy to meet many IPA friends and experience beautiful Albania. He hopes to participate in the next tournament as a member of the IPA Japan team.

Finally, I would like to thank Mr. Nakano and his teammates for their friendship and passion, as well as the IEB and IPA Albania for organising this wonderful event. We would also like to express our sincere appreciation to the IPA friends from around the world and the members of IPA Japan for their encouragement.

Dear friends, fellow travellers on the wonderful journey of the IPA,

MEETING OF IPA PRESIDENTS FROM CENTRAL EUROPE IN MOLDOVA



From June 19 to 22, 2025, the capital of the Republic of Moldova, Chişinău, proudly hosted a key event for the International Police Association (IPA): the meeting of national sections from Central Europe. The gathering brought together IPA representatives from across the region to discuss shared goals, strengthen partnerships, and promote international cooperation.

The official discussions and debates were held in the elegant VisPas Hotel, located in the heart of Chişinău. This welcoming venue provided the ideal setting for constructive dialogue on regional IPA initiatives, cross-border cooperation, and the continuous exchange of professional experiences – all in the spirit of Servo per Amikeco (Service through Friendship).

From the International Executive Board (IEB), Mr. JP Allet, Assistant Treasurer for Social Affairs, took part in the event. He successfully coordinated the meeting, ensuring it was held under the best possible conditions and in a spirit of unity and professionalism.

The significance of this event was further elevated by the involvement of Moldova's Minister of Internal Affairs, who formally welcomed the presidents of the Central European IPA sections. This high-level reception underscored the importance that the Moldovan state attributes to international cooperation and the work of the IPA.



A key milestone during the meeting was the signing of official partnership agreements between IPA Moldova and two of the country's principal institutions: the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the State Protection and Guard Service (SPPS). These agreements represent a firm step toward institutionalising and deepening collaboration, further strengthening IPA's role and presence within Moldova's national security and law enforcement framework.

UK POLICING HeForShe AND SHEisIPA

The #SHEisIPA feature continues throughout the month of August. First up, we hear from Liam Busby of IPA UK and Thames Valley Police, who delivered a presentation during the #SHEisIPA Seminar: Embracing an Inclusive Vision for the Future 2.

On April the 13th I flew over to Germany as I had been asked to deliver a presentation for the International Police Association #SHEisIPA conference titled 'Embracing an Inclusive Vision for the Future 2'. I was representing UK Policing, Thames Valley Police and UK policing HeForShe. My presentation focused on the United Nations HeForShe initiative and what we were doing in the UK around male allyship and gender equity.

I was incredibly proud to be joined by two other colleagues from TVP; Rupinder Gill and Rachel Keys, demonstrating the commitment of TVP in supporting our female colleague's professional development.



The three day conference had 55 delegates from 25 different countries, with exceptional speakers from the Netherlands (Jose Rooijers and Kirsten De Jong), Norway (Inger Grete Lia Stålesen), Bosnia-Herzegovina (Ivana Pavlović), Poland (Aneta Sobieraj), the UK (Hannah Wheeler QPM and Ruth Busby OBE), Ireland (Marie Daly), Montenegro (Biljana Dulovic), Eswatini (Philisiwe Swane), Germany (Ulrike Neuhooff and Silke Paul) ranging from topics such as leadership, technology and A.I., U.N. Policing, networking success and several inspiring personal stories all from incredibly talented and strong female police leaders and one very special woman in rail.

I have learnt so much from these women and I am inspired by their dedication and perseverance in an environment that can be challenging for women if they are pushing against the 'norms' of traditionally male dominated organisations.

I was particularly touched when I was presented with a gift by my Dutch colleagues at the end of one of their presentations. They presented me with a Lego set called 'police for everyone', which has been specially designed and commissioned to assist people delivering training or presenting on the subject of equality, diversity and inclusion. It was a thoughtful and symbolic gesture that I'll be using in future sessions.

There was a true spirit of inclusion and acceptance throughout the event. I have made many new friends both close to home and across the world and I feel privileged to have been invited to speak at this conference. I am excited to have made some professional connections with our Dutch and Moldovan colleagues as they have expressed a strong interest in what UK Policing HeForShe is doing. All of the delegates expressed a desire to identify male allies in support of gender equity so that they could work in collaboration with them.

The International Police Association is a brilliant organisation which draws people together in friendship from across the world so that we can share professional expertise and draw together as colleagues but leave as friends. In a world where many things are uncertain and there is an increasing push towards isolationism, what better way to come together in solidarity. If you are a serving or retired police officer or member of staff, I cannot recommend it enough.

The #SHEisIPA is an incredible initiative which aims to support female IPA members while encouraging more female police officers and staff to join and take full advantage of the fantastic opportunities of friendship and professional development that the IPA has to offer. HeForShe UK policing is committed in support of this initiative, and I personally look forward to the future in helping with this endeavour.

IPA CHIOS, GREECE SUPPORTS FIREFIGHTERS OF WESTERN THESSALY

IPA Region Chios, Greece Provides Comprehensive Support and Hospitality to Firefighters of Western Thessaly

With emotion and gratitude, Chios bid farewell on June 30, 2025, to the firefighters from Western Thessaly, who for days fought the flames in one of the toughest wildfires the island has ever experienced. The firefighters, hosted at the I.P.A. Region Chios Guesthouse, left Chios leaving behind an indelible mark of bravery and solidarity.



The Youth Center of Agios Artemios, where the Guesthouse is located, was literally saved at the last moment. As emphasized by I.P.A. Region Chios, this was made possible “with the help of our Saint, God, and the heroic efforts of the firefighters,” highlighting the frontline people’s struggle as a true act of self-sacrifice and faith.

Cooperation and Unity in Action

I.P.A. Region Chios, in close cooperation with the Civil Protection of the Municipality of Chios, provided shelter and hospitality to the Thessalian firefighters who reinforced the local firefighting force and joined forces with Chios firefighters and citizens in the difficult battle of extinguishing the fire. The organisation stressed that their contribution was decisive and their example remains bright. In a simple but deeply emotional moment, the firefighters left a brief handwritten message that sums up their experience and feelings: “Simple and important.” A phrase which, as members of I.P.A. Region Chios note, captures the essence of their contribution.



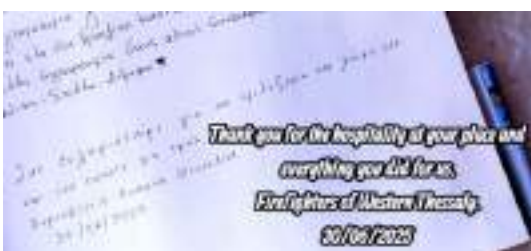
Hope is Reborn from the Ashes

Despite the destruction, the message the organisers of the hospitality wished to convey is clear: “Nothing is the same, but hope is alive here, and not burned.” The environment suffered a serious blow, but faith in regeneration remains unshaken. I.P.A. Region Chios, meaningfully emphasizes that “hope is possible for nature to be reborn from its ashes.”

Under the motto “Servo Per Amikeco” – “I Serve Through Friendship,” I.P.A. Region Chios demonstrated that when needs arise, friendship and solidarity take on real meaning, transcending geographical boundaries.

The departure of the firefighters from Western Thessaly was not merely the end of a mission but the seal of a shared struggle that honored human dignity and duty.

BUILDING BRIDGES THROUGH FRIENDSHIP AND POLICING – IPA PORTUGAL & IPA UK

The International Police Association encourages exchanges between sections to foster friendship, share policing experiences, and strengthen international collaboration. In this edition, we feature two perspectives on a recent exchange between IPA Portugal and IPA UK: one from IPA Portugal sharing their experiences, and the other from the UK participants reflecting on their visit.

POLICE EXCHANGE BETWEEN THE IPA SOUTH DELEGATION – PORTUGUESE SECTION AND THE IPA OF LINCOLNSHIRE – UK SECTION: A MEETING BETWEEN POLICE CULTURES AND VALUES

Inspired by the spirit of the motto “Servo per Amikeco” and the founding vision of Arthur Troop, the police exchange project between the Southern Delegation of IPA Portugal and the IPA of Lincolnshire, United Kingdom, has become a concrete and successful reality, strengthening human, professional and institutional ties.

It all began with an informal visit, in September 2023, by Chris Morgan (IPA Lincolnshire) where, perhaps inspired by the warm welcome at Casa IPA Algarve, by the IPA South Delegation, represented by Fernando Palma. From this friendly contact and in the course of multiple exchanges, the idea was born to structure an exchange between police officers from the two regions – Algarve and Lincolnshire, both with strong tourism dynamics and similar operational challenges, to be developed in two complementary phases.



The idea gave birth to the project and, just over a year later, the first phase of this project began, which ran from September 30 to October 4, 2024, with the visit of four police officers from the Faro District Command of the PSP – Jorge Gregório, Flávio Ramos, Cândido Anjos and Hélder Lopes – to the United Kingdom. During their stay, the Portuguese officers took part in patrolling activities, accompanied their English colleagues on operational tasks and were able to deepen their knowledge of police procedures and local crime statistics. This experience allowed them to absorb useful practices and methods to carry out their duties in Portugal, in line with the strategic principles of the PSP for the three-year period 2025–2027: “Present through Proximity, Close in Security.”



BUILDING BRIDGES THROUGH FRIENDSHIP AND POLICING – IPA PORTUGAL & IPA UK

The second phase of the exchange took place in the Algarve, from 9 to 14 June 2025, with the arrival in Portugal of four officers from Lincolnshire Police – Gemma Oxbby, Nicola Paradowski, Peter White and Nick Elmer. The meeting with their Portuguese colleagues, now friends, was marked by great emotion and a spirit of camaraderie. The official reception took place at the PSP District Command in Faro, presided over by its Commander, Superintendent Dário Prates, who welcomed the group and presented the functioning of the national and regional police structure.

Over the following days, the British officers participated in several police activities, including visits to PSP operational subunits and the new facilities of the Judiciary Police – Southern Directorate.



One of the highlights of this second phase was the participation of the British officers in policing the official ceremonies for Portugal Day, on 10 June, in the city of Lagos. Thanks to the diligence of the Faro District Command, all participants in the exchange were included in the official protocol, and were even honoured to be greeted by His Excellency the President of the Republic, Professor Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa.

If nothing else, the testimonies of the eight police officers involved, both Portuguese and British, confirmed the success of the initiative, which resulted in friendship, sharing of good practices, interculturality and personal and professional enrichment.

This exchange, more than a one-off event, reflects the essence of the IPA – building bridges, sharing experiences and uniting people around common values. Because “Servo per Amikeco” is not just a reason: it is a living and inspiring practice.



May this original idea – simple in its genesis, but grand in its effects – serve as inspiration for future exchange initiatives between other IPA structures, in Portugal and beyond. The challenge remains: why not replicate this model with other countries or even develop exchanges based on specific skills, as suggested, for example, in the area of Canine Training.

1ST PHASE OF POLICE EXCHANGE

*Displacement of 4 police officers from the Faro/PSP – Portugal CD (Jorge Gregório; Flávio Ramos; Cândido Anjos and Hélder Lopes) to Lincolnshire, in the United Kingdom
[Period from 30 SEP to 04 OCT 2024]*

Displacement of 4 Portuguese police officers to the United Kingdom which, as planned, demonstrated that if there is will and dedication in what is proposed and enjoyed, the result cannot be anything other than very positive.

With the Portuguese police officers traveling to various local and regional police intervention locations, through the performance of tasks and patrolling on foot and in vehicles, accompanied by their English colleagues. They were subject to some police statistical clarifications and administrative procedures, where they absorbed experiences and content that only enriches them and in a spontaneous way will contribute to their day-to-day police service, being more capable of demonstrating professionalism and carrying out the PSP strategy for 2025 – 2027 – Present through Proximity, Next in Security!”.

2ND PHASE OF POLICE EXCHANGE

Trip of 4 police officers from Lincolnshire, in the United Kingdom (Gemma Oxby; Nicola Paradowski; Peter White and Nick Elmer) to the Algarve – Portugal (Period from 09 to 14 June 2025)

The arrival of the 4 English police officers to Portugal – Algarve, marked the beginning of the 2nd Phase of the exchange in the Algarve. It began with their arrival at Faro International Airport, which was quite emotional, demonstrating both the Portuguese and English participants' great desire to experience the next few days in an intense and friendly way.

On its first day of work, it had the collaboration of the Faro District Command of the PSP, in the person of its Commander, Superintendent Dário Prates, who welcomed the group and where, there was an attempt to convey to the English police officers how the Faro District Command of the PSP and the PSP in Portugal work.

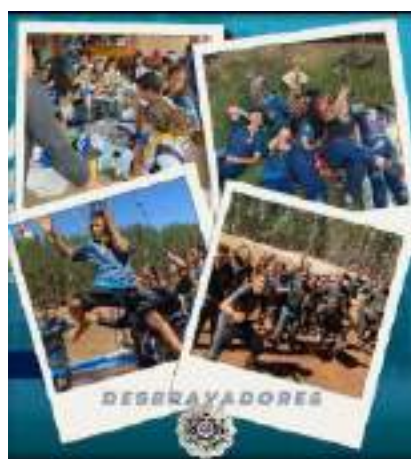

A unique moment of recognition for the members of an institution created by Imperial Decree No. 1775, on July 2, 1856, by Emperor Dom Pedro II, who organised the Provisional Fire Department of the Court.



OTHER ACTIVITIES

In the June/July commemorative period, the IPA in Brazil, based on the basic principle of the IPA worldwide, "Servo Per Amikeco", promoted the celebration of the International Friendship Day (July 30) in advance, launching the Friendship Meeting, with its social project inherent to the Pathfinders group.

The project: "Tuning Lives", aimed at teaching classical music to underprivileged children from areas of social risk. The opening of the return to the project brought together family members of the selected participants, police officers and institutional areas that are partners of the IPA Brazil in this social confrontation.

It was very satisfying to see the emotion of the IPA member, Operational Police Colonel and conductor Lima Filho with his clarinet and baton, at the opening ceremony.



June/July were not just a time for celebrations, as administratively the Brazilian Section of the IPA launched its electoral process to establish the new management of the IPA Brazil for the years 2025 to 2029, which in its first stage (voting) presented the winning ticket with 76% of the valid votes, with the nomination to preside over the IPA in Brazil being IPA member DIOGO DELEUZE. However, the process is still in the final stages (Inauguration and Exercise) in compliance with the provisions of the Entity's Statute and court decisions.

This was the aim of the 1st administrative-accounting and management training seminar for IPA secretaries and treasurers held on May 17th in Udine.

The National Council, during the last annual Congress, unanimously deliberated on the management conduct of the Italian Section, deeming that these issues, although carried out for about 70 years, have not had that feedback of knowledge that can now be within the reach of all members, mainly for the work that the delegations and local units must carry out throughout the year.

This work, thus arranged, will constitute and create the future ruling class of our Section.

The meeting, which was popular in its particularity, was conducted by the National President Nicolangelo Pezone, who explained the composition of the executive bodies of the Section, highlighting the foundations of our internal electoral system, based on representative democracy that guarantees the good health of IPA Italy.

He also recalled the recent changes amendments made to the Statutes in order to broaden democracy and to adhere to the new Italian laws on associations in general.

The National Vicesecretary Francesco Amodeo showed the national website to outline its contents and its operational possibilities, whilst Gerardo Velotto, Treasurer of Region 2 Lombardia illustrated how to keep timely and correct accounting within the online programme, which must be used by all Treasurers (local and regional) of the Italian Section.
